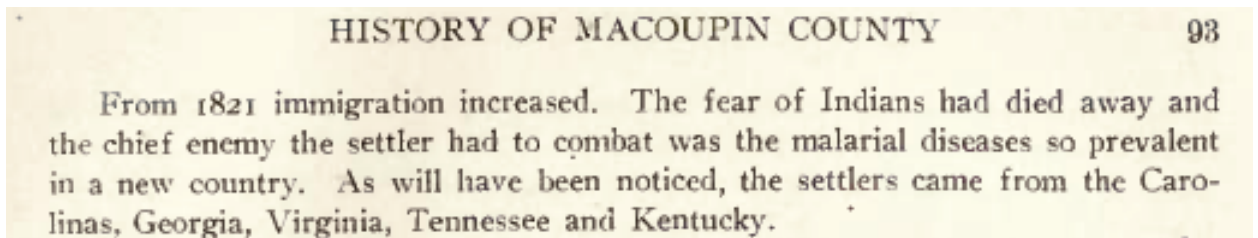

**1840 John Cormack settled in Telemachus Camp, went to Edwardsville, soon returned to Macoupin. Lewis Cormack and his son William returned from Tennessee with James Cowell ... (1821); in 1823, Mr. Wilcox married Polly Cormack in 1823 and they were the second couple to marry in the township.(Wilcox had taught in the first school in Staunton in 1822**



**13 April 1829 with the new County of Macoupin, William Wilcox was elected Judge with two others and William Cormack was one of 78 voters to cast ballots and vote. In May, 1829, Commissioners were elected and Lewis Cormack, William, G Cormack, William Wilcox, and Joseph Hilyard were among those who voted. A County Commissioners Court persisted until 1849 in Macoupin.**
